





Beyond the curriculum we provide a wealth of support...

- Form Tutors the most significant point of contact between home/school.
- Pastoral Managers when something is important and won't wait.
- **Key Stage Progress Leads** who closely monitor progress and performance.
- "Discovery" Personal Development a comprehensive programme which covers aspects of personal, social, health and citizenship.
- Careers guidance a hugely important element of our personal development programme ensuring students can make informed choices.



Teaching and learning



- Emphasis on basic skills across the curriculum: literacy, numeracy and IT skills.
- Students leave us: literate, numerate and digitally confident.
- Active and engaging learning experiences. Students are not passive in the classroom.
- Learning personalised and adapted to the needs of the student within classroom settings; informed by close relationships with our Primary partners.
- Creative use of new technologies to enhance rather than replace traditional methods.

In Years 7-9 students study:

English, Maths, Science, ICT, History, Geography, Languages, Design Technology, Art, Music, Drama, PE and RE.

3 year traditional KS3 programme to develop skills.

A broad rich curriculum.



In Years 10-11 all students study:

English, Maths, Science (3 sciences leading to 2 or 3 GCSEs), a foreign language, RE and PE plus **3** subjects of their own choice



Year 10 and 11 options include

History, Geography, Spanish, Music, Art, Photography, Drama, PE, Health and Social Care, Food, DT, Engineering, Business, ICT and Computing, Photography, Travel & Tourism and more....

At KS4 a broad curriculum is maintained with a range of 3 options from a suite of amazing practical, written, creative, digital and technical qualifications.

We work with you and your child on option choices.

No predetermined pathways based upon ability.



Our sixth form offer is largely A level based with Level 3 Engineering and Health and Social Care.

At KS5 an extensive suite of A-Level and Level 3

Technical qualifications.


